

## Household disposable income (£ billion current prices, seasonally adjusted)




#### **BRC-Nielsen Shop Price Index 2015-2018**


#### LIKE-FOR-LIKE SALES: % CHANGE YEAR-ON-YEAR

Across the board tariff-free trade with the EU should be the top priority of negotiation for the Government


A UK Generalised Scheme of Preferences should be introduced that is as least as generous as that currently offered by the EU

#### NEW TARIFFS MEAN HIGHER PRICES













# NEW TARIFFS on imported goods if no deal

















