## **Local Authority Desktop Sampling Audit Report**

Following our letter of 01 October 2019 advising that we were due to conduct a sampling audit, please find a link to the final report:

<u>FSS/ENF/20/004 - Desktop Sampling Audit Report</u> which is published on the page: <u>Audit-and-Monitoring Page</u> under the section <u>Sampling Activity Audit</u>.

The audit was conducted in line with the terms of the Audit Brief and Plan: <u>Audit Sampling Brief and Plan</u> (FSS/ENF/19/016) which has also been published on the Food Standards Scotland website.

The report raises numerous recommendations for both Local Authorities and for Food Standards Scotland. These include:

- Service Plans to be up to date and include suitable sampling references (LA)
- Enforcement Policies to be up to date and available to FBOs (LA)
- Published documents to be current versions (LA)
- Performance reviews of Service Plans to be required within the Food Law
  Code of Practice (FSS)

monitoring (FSS)

Public Analyst to be appropriately appointed (LA)

• Sampling Policy and Programme to include consultation with Public Analyst

and Food Examiner (LA)

Enhanced intelligence handling and data sharing to be considered (FSS & LA)

successfully delivered.
