Local Authority Performance Monitoring and Audit Programme 2023/2024 and Multi - Annual National Control Plan (MANCP) Requirements

Local Authority Performance Monitoring and Audit Programme 2023/2024

Please find attached details of the Local Authority Performance Monitoring and Audit Programme for 2023/2024 (Annex 1). As the food law delivery landscape is due to undergo a significant period of change as part of the Scottish Authority Food Enforcement Rebuild (SAFER) project, the main focus of performance monitoring and audit for this year will be to verify and validate implementation of any specific direction given by FSS. The outcome of this may mean that guidance is provided as to the action considered necessary to enable Local Authorities to meet any standards determined by FSS or which would help to improve the performance of the authority more generally.





Service Planning

Service planning is key to performance monitoring and we would ask that all Local Authorities focus on drafting Annual Service Plans for the coming year. As required by the Food Law Code of Practice, these should set out planned intervention programmes and service delivery arrangements.

Multi - Annual National Control Plan (MANCP) Requirements

Domestic legislation on official controls requires that the UK has in place a Multi-Annual National Control Plan (MANCP) demonstrating that it has effective official control systems in place for monitoring compliance with, and enforcement of, feed & food law, animal health & welfare rules, and plant health law. FSS will be required to input into this plan shortly and would ask for your assistance in ensuring that your Management Information System and therefore the Scottish National Database (SND) is up to date and verified as accurate. The following information in particular is required:

- Number of FTE Officers (posts allocated and number of officers currently in post) direct entry to SND
- Number of interventions achieved during the reporting year
- Number of enforcement actions (broken down into types of actions, notices)
- Number of contraventions letters



Focussed Audit	LAs have responsibility for	Audits to be planned
Planning and	delivering a range of specific official controls. It is essential that	throughout the year.
Planning and Prioritisation	LAs have effective planning in place to deliver these controls. This focussed audit will be informed by the Service Plan desktop review and LAs selected accordingly.	A summary report will be produced at the end of the programme in addition to individual LA reports. This will feed into the wider SAFER project.
Capacity and Capability	To assess the fitness for purpose of LAs to deliver the Food Service	Intelligence led audits, planned as required throughout the year. These more in-depth audits may be carried out if appropriate.
