Local Authority Performance Monitoring and Audit Programme 2024/2025

I write to inform you of our Local Authority Performance Monitoring and Audit Programme for this year (Annexe 1). As you will be aware, the primary purpose of FSS audits of Local Authorities is to provide assurance that local delivery of official controls for food is compliant with UK legal requirements and official guidance.

The primary focus of our programme this year will be to carry out a review of the delivery of Official Controls in Approved Establishments. The Audit team plans to carry out the review throughout the year with the aim of producing a summary report at the end of the programme.





In addition to this, the audit team will also build on last year's Planning and Prioritisation desktop review and assess whether Authorities met the expectation of their service plans submitted for 2023/2024.

Should it be necessary, broader capacity and capability audits may be carried out throughout the year, particularly where performance concerns are raised or identified by other means of intelligence.

As always, the Audit Assurance Team will continue to provide on-going guidance to support the Local Authorities previously audited and who are working to improve their Service.
