## Notification of Potential Use of Unapproved Live Bacterial Preparations Marketed as "Probiotics" in Animal Feed

We have been alerted to the use of unapproved live bacterial preparations marketed as probiotics (digestibility enhancers or gut flora stabilisers) being used within some horse feeds but understand this may not be isolated to the equine sector.

The only micro-organisms currently permitted for horses in Europe are 4 strains of yeast (Saccharomyces cerevisiae).

Priority 1 of the <u>National Enforcement Priorities 2018/19</u> includes the expectation that Local Authorities, when inspecting feed businesses, as part of their routine work, will look to verify that all additives used in animal feed must be authorised for use, in each species, in line with Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003 on additives for use in animal nutrition.

'Verification of the presence and accuracy of feed labelling particulars, which have the potential to compromise human and/or animal health'



## **Action required by LAs**

Should a LA become aware of the unauthorised use of feed additives, as part of their routine work, they should report this back to the FSS Incidents Team (please see below).

Products of particular interest would include feed supplements targeted across all sectors, especially those marketed as probiotics.

This will enable us to:

- assess the risk on a case by case basis;
- advise on the most appropriate action to be taken;
- monitor the scale of the problem; and
- involve Trade Associations accordingly.

Where FSS becomes aware of a non-compliant feed business, the LA will be notified directly with a view to further investigation.
