#### Introduction

#### **Unit summary**

This unit supports workforce development for those whose role includes responsibilities for the protection of bovine welfare in lairage operations.

The unit is designed for use by operatives and others who carry out these workplace activities. The aim of the unit is to determine competent performance to recognised National Occupational Standards. This unit meets the requirements of EU regulation 1099/2009 for the protection of animals at time of killing.

#### Assessment requirements /guidance

This unit is designed to assess the skills and knowledge of learners in the workplace for roles including responsibilities for the protection of bovine welfare in lairage operations.

The learner must be able to demonstrate their competent performance consistently over a period of time, to meet all of the assessment criteria. This will be achieved by at least two observations of competent performance in the workplace, and may be supported by witness testimony and other workplace evidence. Observations (of at least one species of bovine) must ensure that the learner's working practice is at commercial speed and in compliance with standard operating procedures. Assessment methods appropriate to the learner must be used to assess knowledge and understanding – either on or off the job.

The Improve Assessment Strategy for Qualifications in Food and Drink, Scotland sets out the overarching assessment requirements.
