## Dear all

The Duty CPSO contacted Scottish Salmon (owners) on Sunday morning who provided an initial update on the recovery of the barge and fuel, and they are providing a daily update on recovery operations this week.

The owners are awaiting confirmation from divers that the integrity of the hull has been maintained, as it sank on it's moorings, there is nothing to suggest otherwise.

The vessel is currently in 36mtrs of water.

A team have been out and gathered the plastic pollution that came from the barge (boxes and pipe) and they believe that they have gathered most if not all of it.

The fuel tank which is bunded and contained 2500ltrs of diesel is intact and any breathers have been isolated.

There were also two plastic bunded tanks which contained 1000ltrs of diesel each. These are also intact.

Lastly there was 50ltrs of hydraulic oil in sealed containers.

There are no reports of pollution on the surface and efforts to recover the fuel/oil have commence.

It may take longer to recover the vessel due to it's size and the location.

So far we understand that one of the fuel cubes has already been recovered along with all the plastic boxes and piping.

I will continue to provide updates as received.


